It was good to see the connection with HKUP revived, and also for the first time to collaborate with OUP. It should be noted that the grant for Dr. Kwong's book was approved before he became a Trustee.

During the year, a grant was approved for the publication by HKUP of

Hong Kong Public and Squatter Housing: Geopolitics and Informality, 1963–1985 by Alan Smart and Fung Chi Keung Charles (forthcoming in 2023).

Having spent time in the previous year, developing guidelines both for the way the Trustees should operate and make decisions and for how Publishers should relate to the Fund, the past year saw an effort to develop record-keeping polices for the Fund and later in the year work began to formulate a longer term vision for the Fund.

Finally, it was with great pleasure and gratitude that the Trustees received a substantial anonymous gift that will greatly enhance the Fund's capacity to make grants.
